EXHIBIT A

SECOND:

The Corporation is organized to enable its member municipalities to make the most efficient use of their powers by enabling them to cooperate to provide for community needs by developing, fostering, financing and otherwise supporting and/or promoting the provision of broadband and internet services to the member communities of the Corporation. To accomplish those purposes, and pursuant to Section 2203(8) of Title 30-A of the Maine Revised Statutes, the Corporation shall have the power to issue revenue bonds or promote and facilitate the issuance of bonds by other entities to further those purposes, and the Corporation shall also have the power to acquire, lease and/or sell property in furtherance of its purposes.

EXHIBIT B

SIXTH: The Corporation shall have one class of members. Members shall initially be appointed by the Incorporator, and thereafter shall be appointed by vote of the other then-serving Members. Only Maine municipalities shall be eligible to be appointed as Members of the Corporation. Members shall have the power to appoint and remove members of the Board of Directors of the Corporation as provided in the By-laws, to call meetings of the Board of Directors, to amend the By-laws, and to approve the dissolution of the Corporation.

EIGHTH:

Upon any dissolution of the Corporation or the termination of its activities, the assets of the Corporation remaining after the payment of all its liabilities shall be distributed to its Members, in proportion to their respective financial contributions to the Corporation.
